

SWOMEN Anesthesia Rotation Objectives - Junior Resident

Medical Expert:

- describe the anatomic features of the adult and pediatric airway.
- describe the pharmacology of the medications commonly used in providing Anesthesia.
- describe the principles of operation, uses and limitations of the common anesthesia monitoring devices.
- provide bag mask ventilation to patients with normal airways anatomy.
- demonstrate skill in direct laryngoscopy and at least one alternative intubation technique.
- provide, with minimal supervision, general anesthesia for ASA 1 and 2 patients undergoing uncomplicated surgical procedures.
- demonstrate a strong work ethic and desire to learn.
- recognize their clinical limitations and seek help accordingly.

Communicator:

- rapidly establish therapeutic relationship with patients and their family.
- complete timely, accurate and legible documentation.
- communicate patient summaries concisely to the consultant physician.

Collaborator:

- identify the distinct challenges of community based health care.
- appreciate the multidisciplinary role of the anesthesiologist in perioperative medicine.
- establish solid working relationships with health care providers in the community setting.
- demonstrate respect for the expertise of all health care providers.

Manager:

- list the competing factors in allocation of operating room resources.
- prioritize clinical and educational activities to ensure efficient conduct of the day's operative cases.
- demonstrate the ability to remain calm and organized in emergency situations.
- recognize the position of the Anesthesiologist as a resource to the medical community.
- recognize the limits of clinical care which can be provided in the community setting.

Health Advocate:

- list the central tenets of ethical practice identify areas of patient risk in the clinical setting, compare and contrast these between academic and community based practice
- identify conflicts in the care of individual patients and intervene on their behalf.

Scholar:

- demonstrate knowledge of the principles of critical appraisal.
- demonstrate initiative in ongoing personal learning.
- participate as an educational resource for allied health care professionals in the community setting.
- accept and act upon feedback.

Professional:

- demonstrate honesty and integrity

- demonstrate respect for diversity.
- demonstrate respect for the dignity of patients and fellow health-care workers.
